



# Kindling Farm Grower Position

## Job Description

**Hours:** Up to 37.5 hours a week (though could potentially be a job share). You must be able to work occasional weekends and be flexible to possible seasonal changes to start/end times where needed.

**Length of Contract:** Permanent

**Salary:** Salary Range from **£24,900 - £25,800** per annum (gross) for a 37.5 hour week (pro rata for part time and seasonal hours) plus 5% pension contribution. Salary rate will be dependent on experience of candidate and responsibility level of the role.

**Probationary Period:** 3 months.

**Location:** Kindling Farm, Tarbock Green, Merseyside.

**Preferred Start Date:** 1<sup>st</sup> June 2026 or as soon as possible.

**Responsible to:** Kindling Farm Board of Directors.

### Background:

Kindling Farm was set up to create a fairer and more sustainable food and farming system for all. In April 2023 we purchased a 31 hectare (78 acre) farm in Knowsley, to establish an organic fruit and veg based agroforestry system and show that climate and wildlife focused farming is possible.

We have just had our first growing season (following 18 months of fertility building, establishing our agroforestry system, putting infrastructure in place etc.), and - though shorter than planned - it was a big success. We are now getting ready to scale up our production and markets for the coming season and are looking for skilled, hard working and experienced grower(s) to join us.

We will continue scaling up gradually this season (while we build up our markets, team and infrastructure), producing a range of fieldscale veg (courgettes, squash, brassicas, celery, beetroot, leafy greens etc.) and polytunnel crops (tomatoes, spring onions, cucumbers) in our 720m<sup>2</sup> tunnel (which we hope to increase next season as finance allows). We also hope to expand our strawberry beds (we started with 4,000 plants this year); and will continue planting our agroforestry system this winter as well as delivering our Countryside Stewardship and Sustainable Farming Incentive agreements at a farm level.

So, there is a lot to do! Kindling Farm is a very small team and we have relied heavily on our amazing volunteers and short term seasonal growers during this first season and while this involvement will continue we need to build a team of growers to take us up to the next level. We are looking for the right person/people with the skills, practical experience (including use



of machinery) and passion to help us deliver our ambitious plans. This role will work with and be supported by the Kindling Farm team, with guidance from our farm advisors who are a fountain of knowledge and experience.

We know that this is a challenging role, but we think it will be an extremely rewarding one and if you think it is for you we look forward to hearing from you.

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**Role:** The primary role of the grower will be:

**Crop production** in the tunnels and at a field scale. This will involve a mix of Tractor work for field scale cultivations, planting and weeding and tasks by hand e.g. planting, weeding, harvesting.

The role will also involve irrigation, crop storage and transportation.

**Other tasks will include working with the Farm team to carry out:**

- **Tree care**
- **Land management** (delivery of our Countryside Stewardship and Sustainable Farm Incentive Agreements).
- **Farm Machinery/infrastructure:** Maintenance, repair and purchase of farm machinery and equipment.

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**Detailed Job Description:**

**With the support of and in coordination with the Kindling Farm team the Main Duties will be:**

**A. Crop Production & Farm Infrastructure:**

- Implement the crop plan for our first growing season including:
  - Bed preparation, soil cultivation and weeding
  - Crop care including pest management & irrigation
  - Harvesting, packing, storing
  - Deliveries.

This will involve a mix of tractor work e.g. field scale cultivations, planting and weeding and tasks by hand, planting, weeding, harvesting (both in the tunnels and at a field scale).

- **Organic certification:** ensure we meet the Soil Association standards (both in production methods and in maintaining records (you will receive guidance/instruction from the farm team)).



- Help maintain farming infrastructure including water storage tanks, irrigation, polytunnels, gateways, tracks, etc.
- Help maintain farm vehicles, tractors, implements and other machinery/equipment.
- Work with the Farm Team to implement the farm’s agroforestry plan (including fruit tree care and planting new trees).

**B. Land Management:**

- Implement an annual maintenance programme (mowing, field margins, hedge maintenance etc.).
- Implement an annual programme of pest management.
- Work with the Biodiversity Working Group to accommodate biodiversity improvement work.

**C. Health and Safety:**

- Liaise with the Farm Team to maintain the security of the site and the safety of all those who use it.

**D. General responsibilities of this post:**

- Report to Kindling Farm Director.
- Reflect Kindling’s vision and principles, strategy and policies at all times.
- Be aware of and comply with all relevant policies and procedures.
- Fulfil such other duties and assignments as may be required from time to time.
